You will complete the nationally accredited and recognised unit of competency, and be issued a Statement of Attainment for CPCCOHS2001A Apply OHS requirements, policies and procedures in the construction industry.

This unit not only satisfies the requirement to assess the new 'White Card' unit, but it can also be used towards several qualifications if you decide to do further study. There is just the one full fee price for the course.

Unfortunately there is no funding available.

You can start and complete the course/unit before paying for it.

You will have immediate access to all content and assessments without having to pay upfront.

You can enrol, and complete the course, 24/7, 365 days of the year.

As soon as you complete all tasks, and we have received your course fees, you will receive instant access to your Statement of Attainment via an email you will receive and/or through our online system. No waiting 21 or more days for it.

Even though you will be working on the course from home, in your own time, you still have access to trainer support.

Requirements

You will need the following to complete the course/unit online from home:

- Access to a computer, laptop or tablet that has a webcam.
- Access to the internet.
- An internet browser (Chrome, FireFox or Safari, not Internet Explorer or Edge.)
- **Personal Protective** Equipment (PPE) such as a hard hat, eye protection, hearing protection, gloves, high vis jacket and safety boots.

You WILL NOT need to purchase any software, text books or other resources apart from what is listed above.

Whilst the access and use to the PPE equipment listed above is highly desirable, you are still able to complete the relevant assessments if you do not have any. Simply let us know when you come to do the assessment that you do not have the PPE and outline the steps you would take in lieu of.

Duration

It is extremely hard to give an indication as to how long it will take you to complete the course, as it is competency based, ie if you have some knowledge already in the areas and topics, you may be able to complete the course in half or less time than someone who does not.

We have had students complete within a couple of days, while others have taken a couple of months.

However there is no minimum or maximum time.

Nominal duration (what is usually allowed for funding purposes only) is 20 hours.

Course structure

Some topics covered by the course include:

- Hazards and risks
- Duty of care
- Incident reporting and legislation
- Hazardous materials, signs and symbols
- Controlling risks
- Asbestos containing materials
- · PPE, tools and equipment
- Barricades
- SDS, JSA and SWMS
- Environmental requirements
- Types of fire and fire equipment
- First aid or minor injuries
- Emergency response and evacuation

Assessments

Assessments will be in the following form:

- Computer marked: a mix of computer marked questions will be used such as true/false, fill-inthe-blanks, multi-answer, click in order, click the image, etc. The computer will mark your answer immediately. If your answer is correct, you will proceed to the next question. If you get the answer wrong, you can attempt again, however you may get a different variation to the question. Full resources are provided for every question.
- Trainer marked: you will be required to complete assessments and upload for us to assess. These assessments include short answer responses to a question, obtain certain documents online and upload, complete a hazard report template, etc.
- Video response: you will be required to use your webcam to create a video where you answer questions. The video is created in our system. Some video responses will require you to talk about and demonstrate PPE.

If you wish to apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL), please contact us at admin@pcdtraining.edu.au

For an RPL application you will be required to complete the following:

- 1. Provide evidence, such as photos, videos and/or other documented evidence, and
- 2. Provide at least three (3) third party testimonials, and
- 3. Complete an on-site or online interview by PCD, and
- 4. Complete a quiz based on the unit, and
- 5. Provide a video response outlining your experience and why you have covered all aspects associated with the unit CPCCOHS2001A.

All of the above will be used to cover all requirements of the unit CPCCOHS2001A, eg performance criteria, critical aspects, required knowledge, etc. You can view the full requirements of the unit at:
